Please describe what you like best about the school/school district you are reviewing:

There are a very few teachers that have passion for their special ed job. Our school has a great and positive culture towards all special needs kids. The other teachers and children are very kind to our kids.

Please describe what you like least about the school/school district you are reviewing:

There are special ed teachers and general ed teachers that are working with special needs children that don't appear to want to be in their occupation. They don't know how to communicate with the kids, have no understanding on how to teach and think outside of the box and make no effort to help the child stay on course with their grade level. In the recent year the 11% popoulation of the special ed department is shouldering 61% of the systems cost cuts to save money. That is bad math.

What changes would you like to see made at the school/school district you are reviewing:

More open-mindedness towards special ed. We are going to have more children with Autism specifically as the years go by. We are not looking ahead as to how to manage that growth area. Our system is trying to consolidate children to save money. They need to streamline each school to be prepared to handle in influx instead of housing them together to save money.
